## Service with a vision

**PERSONALITY** Nethrodaya's C. Govindakrishnan has lent a helping hand to many visually challenged people, an effort that has earned him the Ashoka fellowship

Govindakrishnan belongs to the newest breed of entrepreneurs — the social entrepreneurs. Worldwide, social entrepreneurs are leaving an epochal impact on society, taking the performance of their NGOs into superior planes of performance. They are getting recognised too.

This year, Govindakrishnan, whose Nethrodaya has been lending a helping hand to visually challenged, has been chosen as Ashoka Fellow by the Ashoka Innovators for the Public, an international society that discovers and promotes social

entrepreneurs.

"The fellowship gives me a chance to explore possibilities in the international circuit. It also gives me a lot of confidence," says Govindakrishan or Gopi to friends.

It all began with an innocuous train journey that Gopi undertook. To his surprise, he found that of the 119 visually challenged persons who were begging 82 were graduates. Gopi subsequently did a more research for his post-graduate studies in Social Entrepreneur skip from the Centre for Social Initiatives and Management.

#### Resource centre

"It prompted me to start Nethrodaya as an in-house resource centre to equip the vi-sually challenged with skills that can get them employ-ment," says Gopi, himself vi-sually challenged. Today, apart from its in-house resource centre for graduating adults that catalyses college education and employment, Nethrodaya runs a 24-hour help line (26565012) for the visually challenged requiring medical assistance, a self-employment scheme, programme that helps families access rental accommodation by convincing house owners to offer their tenements to these families. Nethrodaya's annual sports events has become a public affair. The latest feather in Nethrodaya's cap is its newly inaugurated wing for visually challenged women. All this within three years of its existence, a fact that perhaps got Gopi recognised as an 'Ashoka Fellow

for the visually challenged are heavily taxed! The government needs to get sensitive to the needs of the visually challenged. Right from accessible public infrastructure to examination systems, we need a massive change in mindset and policies," Gopi says.

He would like to see things

He would like to see things like more electrical plug points in classrooms for blind students to tape lessons and modified sports events for the blind in all

"Yes, we need more funds. colleges. more readers, more volunteers. It is impossible to make a social outfit self-sustaining," says Go-pi admitting that Nethrodaya survives on the generosity of patrons. That's immaterial; sustaining the success it has seen in these three years will be an achievement by itself. Interested persons can give a helping hand to these visually challenged by contributing a day's food, devoting a few hours every week to read out from books, donating books or providing expertise. 


